Option A No Outsiders

Andrew Moffat is the author of No Outsiders and PD Lead for Excelsior MAT. No Outsiders is a whole school ethos and language that teaches children everyone belongs. Referencing the Equality Act, British values and RSE guidance, No Outsiders uses picture books and assemblies to explore identity, recognition and acceptance of difference, and promoting community cohesion. Andrew faced significant challenge to his work in 2019 over the inclusion of LGBT+ equality in No Outsiders, and he will talk about meeting parent challenge in a proactive and inclusive way.

Delegates will leave this session with lesson and assembly plans, and renewed confidence in the teaching of equality and diversity in their settings.

Option B Logically Illogical

Ros Blackburn is an adult with autism. At three months old she appeared withdrawn, isolated and very much in a world of her own. At 18 months she was diagnosed very severely autistic but with average intellectual ability. Now in her 50s, Ros lectures nationally and internationally, giving insight into her own experiences and the care and education practices she has observed.

In this workshop, Ros explores with humour and passion the "mistakes" from which she has had to learn and some of her coping strategies. From these she is able to offer helpful strategies – including what not to do – when understanding and managing autism in mainstream schools.

It is Ros's wish that all those who attend her talks find them helpful and informative but, above all, that the experience is entertaining and full of fun. Ros last presented to Essex heads 10 years ago, and she was exceptionally well-received at the time.
