In March 2020 the termly EPHA meetings were held in the usual venues across the county, and the main discussion focused on "lessons learnt" from recent Ofsted inspections along with the introduction of the new SEND teams. However, Clare Kershaw did give headteachers early information on the emerging Coronavirus – she reported that on the 9th March 2020 there were 5 confirmed cases in Essex. By the 23rd March, schools were (partially) closed and life changed for us all – of course no one realised for how long this would continue.

The negative impacts of the pandemic are too many to list, not least of course the unfathomable number of deaths and sickness, which continue to increase every day. Everyone has been impacted both personally and professionally and headteachers have carried the emotional burden of many families whose lives are turned upside down, as well as coping with their own anxieties. The spring term EPHA Executive Meeting took place on 21 January 2021. The agenda included a discussion with Sue Baldwin, Regional Schools Commissioner, about the work of her office and, in particular, questions about the future of Ofsted, assessment and the arrangements for half term!

The main focus of the meeting was on the impact of the partial closure of schools, as well as the recent introduction of Lateral Flow Testing in primary schools. Questions and concerns were taken forward to the meeting with the Education Director later in the morning. That agenda included:

- Questions and views about the current lockdown and the support available to schools, including for those children with EHCPs
- Discussion around how schools can carry out welfare checks and what part social care and other agencies (should) play
- An update on the Headteacher Wellbeing programme
- A summary of school funding decisions for 2021/22
