<p><b>COMPASSIONATE LEADERSHIP</b> <b>Dame Alison Peacock</b></p> <p>Dame Alison Peacock will talk about the need to lead with compassion as we move through and beyond the pandemic. Leaders have shown what is possible to achieve when they work in collaboration and where time is given to what is important and really matters. She will describe a future where an inclusive curriculum offers hope to all, where we can be more intelligent about accountability and where social action and pupil voice is respected.</p> <p>Following her keynote there will be an opportunity to engage in conversation with Alison where she will share her views about government priorities and ways in which through enhanced professionalism we can lead education.</p> <p>Professor Dame Alison Peacock is Chief Executive of the Chartered College of Teaching, a new Professional Body that seeks to raise our status through celebrating, supporting and connecting teachers to provide expert teaching and leadership. Prior to joining the Chartered College, Dame Alison was Executive Headteacher of The Wroxham School in Hertfordshire. Her career to date has spanned primary, secondary and advisory roles. She is an Honorary Fellow of Queens' College Cambridge, member of the Royal Society's Education Committee, and a Visiting Professor of both the University of Hertfordshire and Glyndŵr University. Her research is published in a series of books about Learning without Limits offering an alternative approach to inclusive school improvement.</p>	<b>9.20 -10.45</b>
