#### 1. EPHA WELCOME

#### 2. MORE TALK, MORE ACTION!

For the last fifteen years, Jason Buckley has been developing a unique, lively approach to dialogue and philosophy for children. Over 17,000 teachers in over 100 countries receive his weekly bulletin of stories and other resources (see <a href="https://www.thephilosophyman.com">www.thephilosophyman.com</a>)

There's always been a gap in each class between the confident speakers and the "silent six" who speak up rarely, if at all, and the gap seems to be getting wider. Multiple studies suggest that a key factor is not so much the overall volume of language children experience, but the quantity and quality of conversational turns that children experience.

In this very lively session participants experienced many ways to get a buzz of energized and thoughtful talk in the classroom that makes up for lost ground, draws in those reluctant speakers and is fun for everyone.

- Get Moving thinking games and activities that compel ENGAGEMENT
- Y-Questions questions and stimuli that you can discuss and debate until the cows come home to provide CHALLENGE. (Do cows have a home?)
- Take a Back Seat facilitation and questioning techniques that allow you to step back and develop children's INDEPENDENCE

All delegates received supporting mini-books and access to a download page with all the resources used during the session, as well as a free sample of "Sticky Questions", a school-to-home-to-school resource that helps put these principles into action. They also received a link to a training video to use with staff to share some of the techniques at a staff meeting.

During the session, Jason advised the use of contentless coaching questions, which are great for eliciting deeper thinking without putting your own ideas into the conversations. These include:

- Can you tell me more?Can you say why?
- So... [repeat the main question]
- Can you give me an example?
- How do you mean?
- Why is that important?



- What would change your mind?
- How could you disagree with yourself?

Jason gave some useful guidance about teaching gifting children, including breaking out of reading schemes. He also advised not just adding additional work, but providing the most difficult first; developing "passion projects" that the pupil can keep going back to; teaching the child, not the age. He suggested that there must an "equality of struggle" for all pupils, otherwise the brightest will get bored and demotivated.

#### 3. EPHA UPDATE
