Executive Meeting with the Local Authority

At the termly meeting on 28 January, the EPHA Executive discussed a number of key issues with Local Authority officers. These included updates on:

- the SEN reform programme and introduction of new Autism Hubs in Essex;
- the challenges of primary exclusion, part-time timetables and support for children with severe emotional and behavioural challenges;
- the assessment and moderation process this year, and what support is available from the LA;
- the new recruitment and retention strategy in Essex.

EPHA Executive discussion and feedback

The EPHA Executive meets termly to discuss topical and strategic issues that are affecting primary heads. The **Spring term meeting** included a Leadership Team update, with news about Schools Forum decisions, the quality of the Schools' Broadband service and feedback from EPHA representatives who had attended meetings on behalf of primary heads. Councillor Ray Gooding, the ECC Cabinet Member of Education and Lifelong Learning, attended the meeting and was asked searching questions about the LA's strategy for education and the future relationship with schools. He recognised the challenges that heads face in the current education climate, describing the job as "a race with no tape". He stressed his commitment to Essex schools and noted his belief that the support, experience and expertise of LAs will continue to exist in some shape or another. He also stated that, in his opinion as Lead Member, not all primary schools would necessarily become academies, despite the current government rhetoric. He accepted that the LA needs to offer more consistent support to all schools, not "too little, too late". However, this is a challenge given the reducing capacity of the LA.
